Gramática. Estructura del verbo **tener** en con primera y segundas personas singular y plural: have got (tener) haven't got (no tener). Vamos a utilizar cuatro pronombres hoy: **I** (yo); **you** (tú); **we** (nosotros); **you** (vosotros).

- Diremos "I have got..." / 'ai 'hæf got/ yo tengo...
- Diremos "you have got..." / 'ju: 'hæf got/ tú tienes... o vosotros tenéis (se escribe igual pero son dos pronombres)
- Diremos "we have got..." / 'wi: 'hæf got/ nosotros tenemos...

ERROR COMÚN EN WRITING: **HASN'T** (sin e) // **HAVEN'T** (con e). Recordad *she hasn't*; *I haven't*.

El pronombre **yo** en inglés se escribe con una i latina mayúscula siempre (**I**).
