




# Who is who? Match!

PRONUNCIACIÓN: *Polar bear* (/ˈpəʊlər ˈbeər/): oso polar. *Giraffe* /dʒɪˈra:f/: jirafa. *Fly* /flaɪ/: mosca. *Tortoise* /tɔ:rtəs/: tortuga. *Turtle* /tɜ:rtəl/: tortuga. *Fox* /fɒks/: zorro. *Deer* /dɪər/: ciervo. *Flamingo* /fləˈmɪŋgəʊ/: flamenco. *Fish* /fɪʃ/: pez. *Seal* /si:l/: foca. *Elephant* /ˈelɪfənt/: elefante.

INTERESTING FACT: *tortoise* y *turtle* se traducen ambas por tortuga. *Turtle* puede englobar a los dos grupos. De hecho, en este cuento se utiliza *turtle* para nombrar a la tortuguita que aparece. Normalmente, las distinguimos de la siguiente manera:

- Con *tortoise* nos referimos a una tortuga que vive sobre tierra (tiene patitas). Normalmente son animales herbívoros. Pueden vivir en climas muy diversos.
- Con *Turtle* nos referimos a una tortuga que vive en el agua (mares y océanos) y sale a tierra solo a poner huevos (tiene aletas). Son omnívoras.
